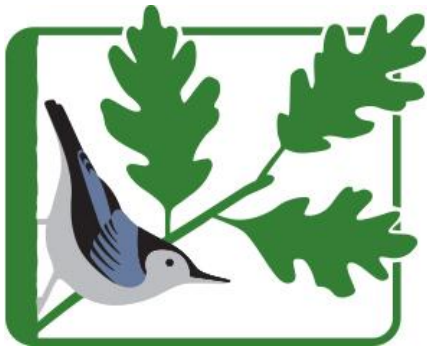

School's Out, Get Outside!

Policies and Procedures

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Program, Registration, and General Policies

Program

When school is not in session, students can spend a day at Briar Bush exploring the outdoors, meeting live animals, making crafts, playing in nature, and more!

School's Out, Get Outside! is a drop-off program for participants in Grades K-5. Depending on overall enrollment, participants may remain together as one mixed-age group or be divided into two groups by age.

School's Out sessions loosely follow the Abington School District calendar and are offered on select holidays and in-service days.

School's Out is led by one educator per twelve participants with a maximum of twenty-four participants per session.

Registration

Registration for School's Out is required in order to participate. Registration is completed on a per-session basis; each session date must be selected individually.

If a session is not listed on the program selection page during registration, the session may be full or registration has closed (Sessions may close one week or more in advance of the date. Please take note of each session's exact registration close date/time on the program selection registration page.)

We are unable to accommodate participants over the program capacity. If a session is full, we encourage calling in to join the waitlist.

Cancellation Policy

If you cancel the program 15 days or more before its start date, you will receive an 80% refund (20% service fee). No refunds will be issued within 14 days of the program start date. To cancel, email Melissa Eldridge at melissa@briarbush.org.

Health and Safety Policies

Participant Autonomy / Assistance Requirements

In order to participate in drop-off programs:

- All participants must be able to communicate their needs to staff.
- All participants must be potty-trained and capable of using the restroom on their own.
 - If a participant has a minor bathroom-related accident and needs assistance with changing, two staff members may assist the participant.
 - If the participant has a major bathroom-related accident, parents/guardians will be contacted to assist the participant with clean-up and changing.
- All participants must be able to change themselves with minimal assistance.
 - If a participant needs assistance with changing, two staff members may assist the participant.

Health / Safety Concerns and Considerations

The health and safety of our participants is our top priority.

- Medical and Pick-Up Consent Form
 - A [Medical and Pick-Up Consent Form](#) must be completed for each participant before the program date.
 - This form is valid from June through to the following May.
 - You will need to log in to the registration system, complete the form, click 'Continue,' click 'Checkout,' then click 'Complete Order' in order for the form to be submitted. You will receive a confirmation email of the submission.
 - Participants without a completed form are not permitted to attend the program.
 - If there are changes to the medical form, please contact Melissa Eldridge, Program and Summer Camp Director, at melissa@briarbush.org.
 - Medical Conditions
 - If you list a medical condition on the medical form, we ask that you provide as much detail as possible.
 - If your child is being treated for a condition that is currently managed by a medical professional, you must submit an action plan provided by the medical staff.
 - If your child has food/environmental allergies, please note that Briar Bush Nature Center is a public facility and, as a result, not allergen-free.

- Medications
 - Dispense any required medications to your child before the session begins.
 - If your child is required to take medication during the session, indicate your child's medications on the medical form. Your child must be able to self-administer medication.
- Accommodations
 - At Briar Bush Nature Center, we believe nature is for everyone. If your child requires accommodations while participating in the program, describe those accommodations on the medical form.
 - Please note that while our staff participates in trainings relating to various cognitive and behavioral conditions/disabilities, staff members are not behavioral intervention professionals and may not have the capacity for all special medical, behavioral, or social support.
 - Please reach out with any questions regarding support for your child.
- Emergencies
 - Parents/guardians must be reachable by phone during the session.
 - Please add Briar Bush Nature Center (215-887-6603) to your contacts.
- Poison Ivy/Ticks
 - While exploring in nature, participants may encounter poison ivy and/or ticks. Our staff is knowledgeable in locating both hazards and treating them.
 - Parents/guardians are encouraged to check participants for ticks at home.
- Severe Weather
 - The sessions take place indoors and outdoors, rain or shine, for varying durations of time. Dress appropriately for the weather. You will be contacted in the case of cancellation due to extreme weather.

Program Packing List

Participants must be appropriately dressed for the program.

- Participants must dress for outdoor play in all types of weather.
- Participants must wear comfortable clothing and closed-toed shoes/sandals. Flip-flops and other open-toed shoes are not permitted due to safety concerns.

Each participant must come prepared to the program with a backpack of the following items:

- refillable water bottle
- non-refrigerated/no-heat lunch and snacks
- weather-appropriate clothing/gear (rain jacket/boots, sunscreen, insect repellent, snow gear/boots)

- full change of clothes (shirt, pants, underwear, socks, shoes) as participants may get extremely wet/dirty during activities

Personal items such as games, toys, electronics, etc. must be left at home.

Behavior/Disciplinary Policies and Procedures

Behavior Expectations / Rules

Staff and participants deserve a safe and enjoyable program experience. Participants are expected to exhibit appropriate behavior and follow the program rules, such as respect yourself, others, nature, and property; listen to your leader and follow directions; and stay with your group.

Accommodations / Support

Briar Bush Nature Center offers inclusive programming in which staff strives to accommodate participants and set them up for success. However, we may not have the capacity for all special medical, behavioral, or social support. If your child has one-on-one support in the classroom, we encourage that the support continues during programming. Please reach out with questions regarding support for your child.

Disciplinary Procedures

Staff will provide positive reinforcement for appropriate behaviors such as granting verbal praise/recognition, offering small rewards such as high-fives or stickers, awarding special privileges, etc.

Examples of inappropriate behaviors are listed below, but this is not an extensive list.

- **Level 1:** Disruptive behaviors
 - Offenses: Interrupting the educator, disrupting activities, ignoring directions, etc.
- **Level 2:** Inappropriate behaviors
 - Offenses: Disrespect toward staff/volunteers/participants/animals, defiance/non-compliance toward staff/rules/regulations, refusal to follow directions/group, inappropriate gestures/language, misuse of property, etc.
- **Level 3:** Aggressive/threatening behaviors that endanger the wellbeing of self, staff/volunteers, participants, and/or animals
 - Offenses: Hitting, kicking, shoving, pushing, bullying, threatening language, damaging property, etc.

Depending on the repetition or severity of a behavior, a particular step or steps may be skipped. Removal from the program is a possibility depending on the severity or continuation of inappropriate behavior. Program fees are non-refundable if a child is removed.

The disciplinary procedures are described below.

- **Redirection**

- The educator will attempt to redirect the participant and inappropriate behavior by conducting verbal or non-verbal phrases/gestures, standing near off-task participant, asking self-correcting questions, involving/engaging off-task participant in an activity, etc.

- **Verbal Warning**

- The educator will acknowledge the inappropriate behavior and demand that it stops immediately. The educator will describe the appropriate behavior that is expected

and inform the participant that loss of privilege or removal from activity will occur if the inappropriate behavior continues.

- **Loss of Privilege / Removal from Activity / Notice to Parents/Guardians**

- If the inappropriate behavior continues, the educator will remove a privilege or remove the participant from an activity.
 - Loss of Privilege may include the inability to use toys, games, or props; sitting next to a friend; etc.
 - Removal from Activity may include the inability to participate in an upcoming lesson, game, or activity.
- The educator will record the incident and action taken. The educator and Program/Summer Camp Director will inform parents/guardians of the incident.

- **Loss of Privilege / Removal from Activity / Discussion with Parents/Guardians**

- If the inappropriate behavior continues, the educator and Program/Summer Camp Director will discuss the behavior with parents/guardians as well as the next steps moving forward.
- The educator and Program/Summer Camp Director will record the incident and action taken.

- **Removal from Program Session / Removal from Program**

- A Level 3 Offense or continued inappropriate behavior may result in Removal from the Program Session or Removal from Program as a whole.
- The Program and Summer Camp Director will discuss the behavior with parents/guardians as well as the next steps moving forward.
- Refunds are not issued after Removal from Program Session or Removal from Program.
